School Improvement Overview

School Improvement (SI) Schools

Graded public schools identified for support and intervention by the Department because the school earned a grade of "D," and grade of "F" or produced a graduation rate of sixty-seven (67) percent or less. (Rule 6A-1.099811, F.A.C.)

School Improvement Overview

Turnaround Schools

Graded public schools that are in Tier 2 or 3 of School Improvement.

- **Tier 2 SI school:** Any school that earns a single grade of "F" or consecutive grades of "D" in any school year in which the school received a grade and is in the first cycle of turnaround. (Rule 6A-1.099811, F.A.C.)
- **Tier 3 SI school:** Any school that has completed one or more cycles of turnaround and has not improved its grade to at least a "C." (Rule 6A-1.099811, F.A.C.)





Amendments to Rule 6A-6.0531, F.A.C., Reading Achievement Initiative for Scholastic Excellence (RAISE)

- Evidence-based reading instruction proven to accelerate progress of students exhibiting a reading deficiency;
- Differentiated instruction based on screening, progress monitoring or student assessment data to meet students' specific reading needs; and
- Explicit and systematic reading strategies to develop phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension with more extensive opportunities for guided practice, error correction and feedback.



Cut Scores for Benchmarks of Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) Standards

- Approved by the State Board of Education on October 18, 2023.
- Includes Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST)
 in English Language Arts (ELA) Reading and
 Mathematics, as well as the B.E.S.T. Writing and Algebra
 1 and Geometry end-of-course EOC assessments.


